SADC Business Forum to partner with Mopani for rural ICT

he Southern Africa Development Community's Business Forum is engaging embassies based in the region to find out what business opportunities are available for small businesses, the SADC Business Forum Chairman, Jacob Mabobo told the District LED Forum on Thursday.

"We are looking at building relations with these embassies. As South Africa we are blessed have many embassies and high commissions. How often do we interact with these embassies to find out what it is that can be done in their countries, what are the goods and services that they need in their countries to align our young businesses and to avail the markets that can be accessed.

Mabobo said the SADC Forum is also looking at the issue of ICT connectivity in rural areas, proposing internet cafes to be placed at the royal council offices. "At this day and age when you are not connected you can't do anything. The forum has to look at how do we make sure that connectivity reaches these rural people without them having to travel long distance to access internet connectivity."

Mopani District Municipal council signed a memorandum of understanding with the SADC Business Forum last month. The SADC Business Forum is an intergovernmental organization aimed at furthering socio-economic cooperation an integration as well as political and security cooperation among 16 Southern African states.
