he Mopani District Municipality Executive Mayor Cllr Nkakareng Rakgoale has handed over groceries, mattresses and other basic amenities to the Seshego Disability Centre, at Baloon village in the Maruleng Municipal area on the 25th of July 2018. The Executive Mayor who was accompanied by some Members of the Mayoral Committee, spent a day with eleven people who are being cared for at the centre as part of the Mandela month celebrations.

Speaking during the event the executive mayor Rakgoale has urged the private sector and community members at large to partner with government to ensure that there is a conducive environment for mental health care users at the centre and at other centres across the district. The eleven mental health care users who go to the centre daily are currently attending their programs in a shack.

"We are saying the private partners must come on board to make sure that centres like this have all the resources especially that people have been hiding these kind of children. They are now starting to at least take them out to communities and the public. We must all make sure that they get all the assistance they need." Said the Executive Mayor.

The district's disability coordinator Raymond Mabuza also spoke at the event and gave hope to the centre management. Mabuza highlighted the positive strides and the support that is being given by the Mopani District Municipality to people with disabilities.
