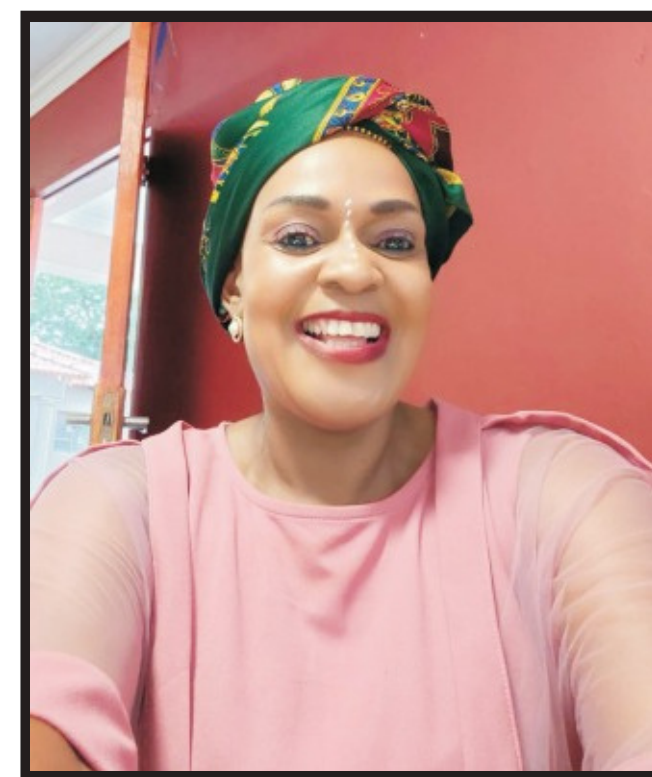

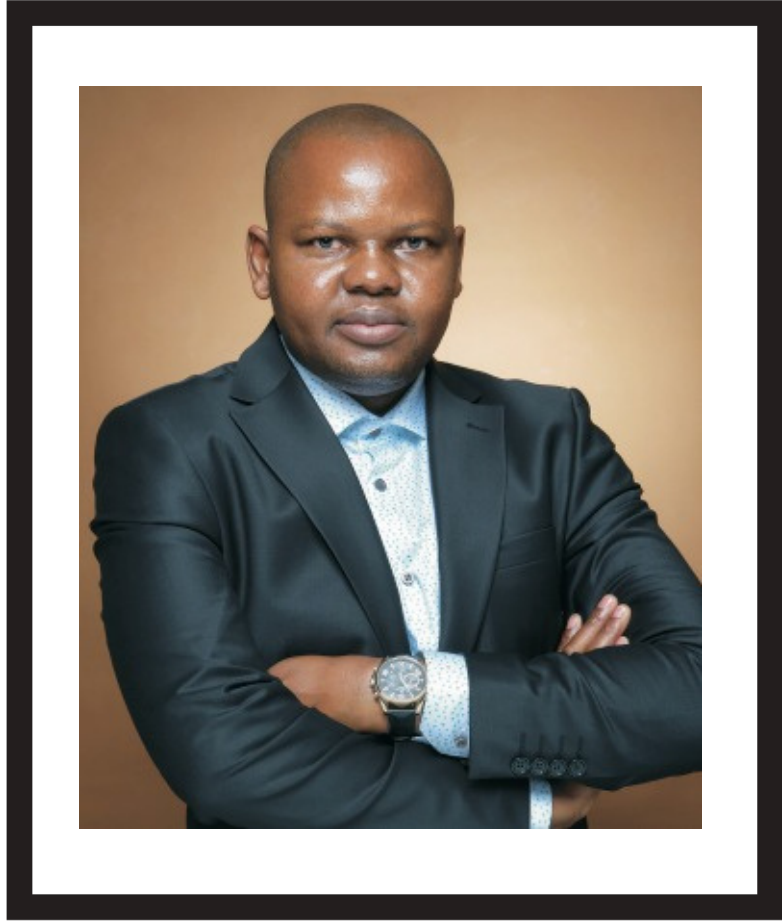

From the Executive Mayor's desk

We have experienced an outbreak of bilharzia in schools around the Greater Tzaneen Municipality, particularly in the Bulamahlo and Lesedi Clusters. We have established the joint operations committee also supported by the Provincial Government. We are here on the ground doing work with the Department of Health, and the Department of Education to try and contain the outbreak.

We need heightened awareness to our communities, especially during this school holidays. We are expecting high temperatures during this period, and our children may be tempted to go to rivers and swimming pools. We therefore have to lead awareness to encourage our communities to avoid or at least take precaution when engaging in activities such as fishing and swimming.

We should also take time to congratulate all our municipalities in the District for having submitted for audit purposes the Annual Financial Statements to the Auditor General - on time. This of course we did in compliance with the dictates of section 126 of the Municipal Finance Management Act, but it is also consistent with our commitment to attain clean audit.

In her 2022-23 consolidated report on the 2022-23 local government audit outcome, the AG has decried the failure by councils to provide courageous, ethical, accountable and citizen-centric leadership. And we agree with her view that service delivery improvement at this level, can indeed only be enabled by stable, capable, cooperative, accountable and responsive municipalities.

This Month is also celebrated as Heritage Month which forms part of our efforts to heal the divisions of the past and establish a society based on democratic values, social justice and fundamental human rights. This is also an opportunity to pay tribute and honour the many struggle stalwarts who gave up their lives for our freedom. EXECUTIVE MAYOR LEADS COMMUNITY FEEDBACK MEETINGS ON THE GIYANI WATER PROJECT

Executive Mayor Cllr. Pule Shayi led his mayoral committee in reaching out to communities where the deadline on the water reticulation projects was not met.

The Municipality is currently implementing water reticulation projects to 24 villages as part of the Giyani Water Project. At least nine villages are receiving water at full supply, four at partially supply. The remaining villages are yet to be connected to the bulk water supply from the Giyani Water Treatment Plant.

The treatment plant is now able to produce around 30 megalitres of treated water every day, with the bulk of the raw water coming from the Nandoni dam. The Nsami dam is currently at just 9,9 percent.

Speaking to the community of Khakhala village on Friday 20 December, the Executive Mayor said all water reticulation projects in the first 24 villages will be completed by end of February in the new year.

The village has an estimated population of around 3000 with 821 households. The project has already covered 27km of water reticulation lines with 530 households currently receiving water from the existing reservoirs. The remaining 291 are set to receive water upon completion and connection of the new 150kl steel tank to the bulk water system.

“We know that this project is not complete, but our observation is some community members are receiving water, and the entire village will be receiving water once we connect the steel tank to the bulk line. We are at 94% overall progress on the water reticulation projects. We have been engaging our communities on these delays. We have already met with the traditional leaders, explained and apologized for the delay.”

The slow progress on the bulk distribution project is also impacting the water reticulation projects. The overall project progress on the bulk water distribution infrastructure is currently at 78% with the revised practical completion date now set at July 2025. An additional sub-contractor has been appointed to help accelerate implementation.

He said the Municipality working with DWS has developed an acceleration plan which will be monitored through the MSTT “We call upon our communities to safeguard the infrastructure, as we move towards completion of this phase, so we are able to move to the Phase 2 targeting the next 31 villages.

The Executive Mayor also used the opportunity to appeal to the community to use water sparingly. “We still call upon our communities to use water sparingly. Our dam water levels are at a critical low. The Nsami dam is at just nine percent, and the implication is that soon will be dependent solely on the supply from Nandoni Dam. Middle Letaba dam is at 0,7 percent and soon we will experience water supply challenges in areas supplied by the Scheme, including Mapuve.”

EXECUTIVE MAYOR TAKES HIS QUARTERLY IMBIZO TO SHAWELA IN GREATER GIYANI MUNICIPALITY

Mopani District Municipality's Executive Mayor Cllr. Pule Shayi took his quarterly mayoral imbizo to Shawela village in Ward 22 of Greater Giyani Municipality, using the opportunity to outline progress on the Giyani Water Project.

The Executive Mayor said there has been significant progress on the Giyani Water Project. "We have been recording major breakthroughs in the Giyani Water Project where we are seeing our communities beginning to get water in their homes. We have long completed the refurbishment work at the Giyani Water Treatment Works. The plant is now able to produce 30 megalitres a day," he said.

He said Lepelle Northern Water is busy with work on the 325km bulk pipelines from the Giyani Water Treatment Works to communities in Greater Giyani. This work is now at 77,2%, with Pipeline A already completed.

"As Mopani District Municipality, our other key task has been to reticulate to households, targeting the first 24 villages. This project is at 92,3 %, and 11 projects have reached completion stage, these are Bambeni, Homu 14A, Homu14B, Mapayeni A, Ndindani, Nwakhuwani, Ngove B, Mageva B, Mhlaba willem, and Maphata."

He said that majority of the communities in the district are still dependent on ground water.“However, only 899 are operational.We have 272 that still need to be energized. We can never do away with boreholes in the District. We have limited water sources here in the District, hence the conceptualization of the Nandoni-Giyani Water Project.



“Nsami Dam is at just 11,4 % right now and we should all be concerned, especially if we are to compare it to this time last year when it was at 51,1%.Middle-Letaba is at 0,7%. We need divine intervention, and greater cooperation from our communities on water conservation, “he said.

The Executive Mayor said 465 houses were damaged by windstorms, three clinics and at least 14 schools, indicating that the damage to households alone in the Greater Giyani Municipality was estimated at over R100 million. He said the Municipality has distributed hundreds of mattresses, blankets tin houses and tents.

He also used the opportunity to encourage community members to register spaza shops within the 21 days timeframe set by President Cyril Ramaphosa.“All of this is, of course not meant to punish our people, but to safeguard the lives of our people, particularly our children at schools. We have been coordinating and leading stakeholders in inspecting the food handling premises and spaza shops. In the past two weeks through our blitz operations, we removed from the shelves over 6000kg and over 1400litre of condemned foods,” he said.



EXECUTIVE MAYOR VISITS CHINA FOR SEMINAR ON POVERTY REDUCTION AND SUSTAINABLE DEVELOPMENT



Mopani District Municipality's Executive Mayor Cllr. Pule Shayi was the leader of the 20-member delegation that visited Beijing in China early this month for a seminar on Poverty Reduction and Sustainable Development.

The Seminar was aimed at exposing the delegation to China's effective practices in achieving the poverty reduction goals of the UN Agenda for Sustainable Development.

The delegation included officials from The Presidency, the National School of Government, Department of Small Business Development, NEDLAC, few lecturers from selected universities, and officials from the Agriculture Departments in KZN, Northern Cape and North West.

China has made remarkable progress in poverty reduction, lifting more that 700 million people out of poverty. It promoted rural land reform, accelerated economic growth in agriculture, strengthened social security to prevent poverty, actively executed practices of agricultural poverty reduction, and expanded experience in international exchanges and corporation.

The 14 days Seminar included lectures, country presentation, case studies and field visits. The Seminar also discussed policies, measures and institutional mechanisms that might strengthen the supply of rural public services, transform rural ecology, achieve strategic objectives of poverty reduction, and improve the capacity of South Africa's projects for sustainable development.





DISTRICT COMMEMORATES WORLD AIDS DAY IN THE GREATER TZANEEN MUNICIPALITY

The Mopani District Municipality led the build-up event to the World Aids Day commemoration at Julesburg village on Friday, 22 November 2024.

Delivering the keynote address, MMC Maripe Mangena on behalf of the Executive Mayor said that it is the combined efforts from everyone that will help ensure a future generation free from HIV as envisioned in the National Development Plan. The theme for the year is: **“Equal Rights, Equal Care.”**

Mangena said that 189 000 people are living with HIV in the district, and 172 000 know their status. “But we only have 119 000 who are on the ARV treatment. And that tells us that as many as 50 000 of our people are still reluctant to take treatment.”

“Get your health checked. Get screened and tested for HIV and TB for free at any clinic near you. Some of the services are available here today. Take action once you know. Begin treatment immediately, but most importantly is that stay on treatment,” he said.

He said the alcohol and drug abuse does contribute to the disruption in the treatment routine. “Live smart, live healthy. Always use a condom. Avoid risky sexual behaviour. We are in this together. We all have a role to play in ending HIV, TB and STIs.”

MMC Mangena also used the opportunity to call on men to help end the scourge of gender-based violence femicide. The 16 Days Campaign on No violence against women and children is this year observed under the theme, **“30 Years of Advancing Collective Action to End Violence Against Women and Children.”** The theme is a rallying call for society to take accountability in the fight against the scourge. Also maintain a healthy, balanced diet to boost your immune system.

He said men must have dialogue where they must challenge each to end the violence against women and children. Let us change the belief that men are strong, and that women are weak or that men have to be in charge.

Government is also using the Disability Rights Awareness Month to shine a spotlight on gender-based violence and femicide on women living with disabilities. The Human Sciences Research Council study shows that apart from economic exclusion, 31 percent of women with disability have experienced physical or sexual abuse.

“Ending this scourge requires the efforts of government, requires the efforts of private sector, requires the efforts of civil society, and it requires the efforts of every member of our society,” he said.

SAYC Mopani elects new leaders



The South African Youth Council in Mopani has elected new leaders during its two-day assembly held at Karibu Leisure Resort on the 14th and 15th of December.

MMC Basani Shibambu delivering the keynote address on behalf of the Executive Mayor said it is SAYC in the District that must come up with solutions to free young people from the shackles of poverty, unemployment, alcohol and drug abuse.

“Many young people today are trapped in the prison of substance and alcohol abuse. Many of our young people today are trapped in the prison of gangsterism. Many of our young people are today trapped in the prison of teenage pregnancy.

“It is this generation of youth activists gathered here this morning that can set yourselves free from all these shackles, in particular the shackles of poverty and unemployment,” she said.

She also urged young people to play a role in ending gender-based violence. “In honour of the 1976 generation, this youth parliament should serve also a platform for you to pledge to continue playing an active role in the fight against gender-based violence.”

“We should be able to use this assembly to take stock thoroughly on the strides we have made as a country in addressing issues facing young people, but importantly, we should be able to answer the question: What needs to be done going forward.”

The message was also echoed by Oliver Mabunda, the Provincial Chairperson of SAYC who said young people must be innovative

EXECUTIVE MAYOR IMPLORES EMERGING FARMERS TO EMBRACE DROUGHT RESILIENT STRATEGIES



Mopani District Municipality's Executive Mayor Cllr. Pule Shayi says he is encouraged to see more young people taking interest in agriculture, which is a key sector in the economic growth of the district, but he has also urged them to embrace drought resilient strategies to mitigate the challenge of climate change.

The Executive Mayor delivered the keynote address at the graduation ceremony of 25 subsistence farmers who participated in the SALGA-AgriSETA learnership program.

His remarks comes on the backdrop of the drought that has hit the district. Premier Dr. Phophi Ramathuba has already announced that the provincial government is formally engaging national government to declare Mopani and Vhembe districts as disaster areas.

The Municipality, together with the Water Research Commission will be hosting a two-day dialogue from 22 – 23 October, which will be a platform to share knowledge, experiences and innovation in rural water supply. The key focus and emphasis will be on the importance of supported self-supply.

EXECUTIVE MAYOR URGES PARENTS TO SUPPORT LEARNERS DURING EXAMS

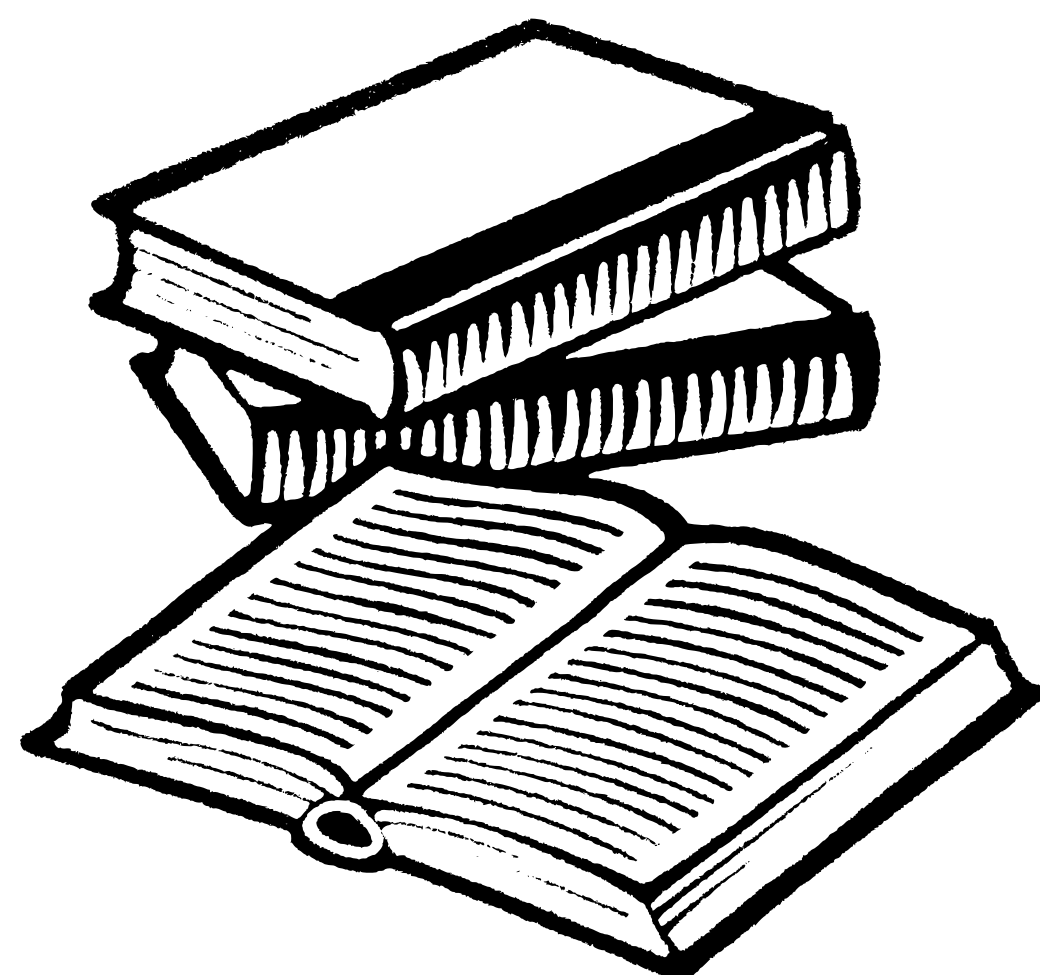
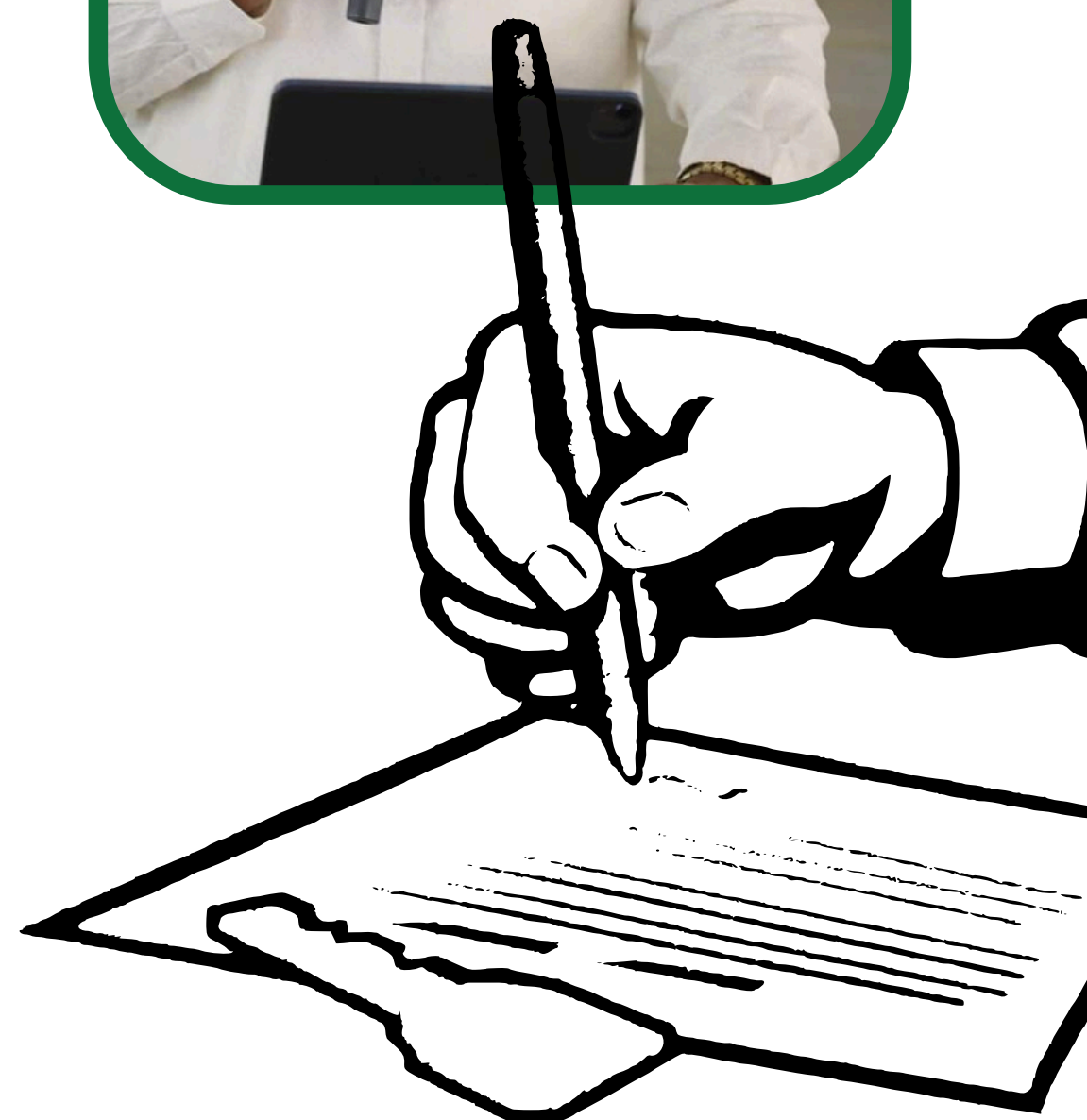

The Mopani West District improved its performance by a remarkable 16,7%, a meteoric rise from 67,1 % in 2021 to 83,8% in 2023.



RAKWADU CLAIMANTS RECEIVE THEIR TITLE DEEDS



As part of government's ongoing programme to reverse the legacy of the 1913 Native's Land Act, Minister Mzwanele Nyhontso of Land Reform and Rural Development has today officially handed over title deeds to the Rakwadu claimants in the Greater Letaba Municipality.

Government spent R77 million to successfully conclude the land claim and restore the land rights to the Rakwadu Community, which is made up of 172 households and 10002 beneficiaries.

In handing over the title deeds of the 2,400 hectares of land, Minister Nyhontso said "it is not merely the handover of the title deeds, but the restoration of your dignity. When the land was taken, so too dignity was taken. Every day our people wait for the land to be restored is another day of humiliation, poverty and loss of dignity," he said.

The minister was joined at the handover by Limpopo's Agriculture MEC Nakedi Kekana, MMC for agriculture in Mopani District Municipality Cllr. Maripe Mangena and several councillors from the Greater Letaba Municipality who were led by acting Mayor Cllr. Thabo Kgapane and Speaker Cllr. Maria Mokgwathi

President Cyril Ramaphosa has pronounced that all spaza shops and food handling facilities must be registered within the municipalities in which they operate within 21 days, from 15 November 2024.

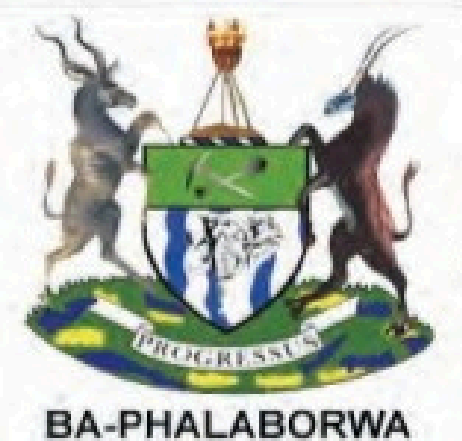
