PREMIER OPENS TAPS AT HOMU 14A AS PART OF HINWAMATI FRIDAY CAMPAIGN



Limpopo Premier, Dr. Phophi Ramathuba visited Mopani District on Friday, 16 August to monitor the water reticulation projects in the Greater Giyani Municipality as part of "HiNwaMati" Campaign.

She visited Homu14A where the Mopani District Municipality is implementing water reticulation to households as part of the first phase of the project, targeting 24 villages. The project is already delivering water to some households as it draws closer to completion.

The Premier who was accompanied by Health MEC Dieketseng Mashego kicked off her day by doing ward rounds at Nkhensani hospital where she also launched Operation Bulamahlo. This initiative is part of the flagship program, Rural Health Matters, which is aimed at reducing cataract surgery backlog in public hospitals. A huge number of patients, mostly the elderly received life-changing eye surgeries on the day.

She later visited led the team on a site visit and tour of the Giyani College which is earmarked to be the campus of Tshwane University of Technology.

Speaking on the sidelines of the Premier's visit, the Executive Mayor Cllr. Pule Shayi said "lot of our grannies are able to see from the operation intervention of Operation Bulamahlo. We are eliminating communities that are beginning to get water, one community at a time. And Homu14A is such as example, and we should be continuing with Homu14B. The campus is a revolutionary intervention in the economic development of our people, not only in Giyani, but across the district."
