

Executive Mayor says the church must continue to uplift the spirit of those dejected by Covid-19





The Mopani District Municipality Executive Mayor Cllr Pule Shayi has called on religious leaders to take a lead in uplifting the spirit of those who have lost hope as Covid-19 continues to destroy the economy and claim lives of people across the globe.

Speaking during the district virtual prayer on Monday, Shayi said the district prayer is about praying for healing of those infected with covid-19, but also for strength to the frontline workers and all those who have lost loved ones to the virus, saying "we pray also for those who have lost hope for we know that hope is what will sustain us."

He said that the pandemic has disrupted lives and has added enormous strain on efforts to rebuild the economy and create jobs.
