

Thanksgiving for Zain takes off at Nkowankowa Stadium



undreds of people gathered to witness the historic 'Thanksgiving For Rain' service at the packed Nkowankowa stadium, in the afternoon of Wednesday 15 March 2017. The Executive Mayor of Mopani District, Cllr. Nkakareng Rakgoale invited members of the public, Pastors, Elders and leaders of all Churches in Mopani, to a say 'thank you God for opening the heavens and let the rain fall on us'. On the 4th November 2016, a 'prayer for rain' service was held at Nkowankowa Community Hall, wherein the Executive Mayor mobilized diversified stakeholders, including Churches, to gather and pray for rain. At that time, the District was going through one of the severest droughts ever witnessed. Dams in Mopani were increasingly getting dry and empty. Animals, both domestic and wild, started to crumble away, people waited patiently as days passed by, the son becomes extremely hot, the land was dry, signs of rain showed no more and all the hopes that it would rain sooner, started to fade. The Executive Mayor, in her speech on the 4th of November 2016 during the day of prayer for rain, after being inspired by the story of the four lepers in the book of 2Kings 7; who were

also in the midst of famine, who asked one another as to why they should sit there and die whereas there's God who promised that those who looked upon Him shall never be disappointed, gave a prophetic speech that: "On behalf of the people of Mopani District, we welcome the abundant rain that the heavens is releasing into our district and our country, owing it to the fervent prayers you have made here today", and she committed by announcing that from her office, there will be a District Day for Prayer even if there's no drought.

It took seven (7) days for the heavens to open up and rain was released in abundance, said Pastor Lucia Hlophe from Ba-Phalaborwa, who was the co-host of the programme with Pastor Mbhungana T.T from Greater Tzaneen, for God of heavens to honour the collective prayers and opened the flood gates of heavens. The Executive Mayor demonstrated clearly that God has changed the situation around and the levels of the dams have risen significantly from the rain God has given.













The Thapane and Merensky dams were empty and now they are 100% full. Nsami dam was below 8%, which resulted in the excretion of its water to be stopped, but now stands at 95%. Middle Letaba dam is now at 95%. Tzaneen dam was at 18% and later shoot to 52%, Modjadji dam was at 19% and currently stands at 66% and Tours dam rose from 20% to 80%. Thabina dam rose from 19% to 100%. This is the evidence that the situation is much better today.

Amongst the dignitaries who attended the service, was Kgosigadi Sekogopo, Kgosi Sekororo, Kgosi Mogoboya, Apostle Moss Ndala who led the thanksgiving prayer item with great diligence and strength, and the worldly revered, Dr. Rev. Elijah Maswangangyi, who was perfectly introduced and well-ushered to the podium to deliver the Word of God by Pastor Strike Manganyi. The message delivered was walking well along the path of the speech of the Executive Mayor, wherein they both called all believers, leaders of Churches and Pastors, to put aside all their differences and work together, to play a role in the developments of Mopani District.

As if that was not enough, praise songs came from national and world renowned gospel artists who came to grace the occasion. Lebo "Lion of Judah" Sekgobela blew out all of us as she helped us send electrifying praises to the Lord God Almighty. Kenny Shivambu's GO EXPLO also left a remarkable performance. Another spirit moving performance was absorbed from Onkgoptse 'The Great' Tiro and Andy 'local ke bosso' Ramatsoma. What a day it was!!!! Puulaa, ayineeeee!!!!!!!







Executive Mayor hosts Imbizo for Pastors

ne of the most effective ways that government utilises to consult members of the public and community stakeholders is through imbizo's. This time, the Executive Mayor held an imbizo, to engage with Pastors in all their different ranks. It is a meeting which one has not seen happen in many years of this democratic government, particularly in Mopani District.

In the morning of the 15th March 2017, the Executive Mayor of Mopani District Municipality, Cllr. Nkakareng Rakgoale invited Pastors, Reverends, Apostles, Bishops, Prophets, Church Elders and Leaders to gather and engage on matters and challenges that face Churches within Mopani District and the work of God in general. More than 300 pastors and Church leaders, form different Churches in Mopani District, attended the meeting, which at the end, they all agreed in one voice, that it was very important and has addressed more important aspects, though it was long overdue. Pastors were amazed and at the same time, expressed much gratitude to the visionary leadership shown by the Executive Mayor, to have at least, separately engaged Churches to discuss the roles that the Church need to play in society as well as to continuously pray for peace in our nation, safety of our towns and villages, safety in schools, exams and bursaries for matriculants, rainfall, drought free land, service delivery infrastructure and others.

The Executive Mayor subscribe to the scripture in the book of **2Chronicles 7:14**, which reads: "If my people, which are called by my name, shall humble themselves, and pray, and seek my face, and turn from their wicked ways; the will I hear from heaven, and will forgive their sins, and will heal their land", as the basis for the meeting. This meeting came about during the time when the Executive Mayor went from one municipality to the other, one Pastors fraternal to the other, asking and lobbying Pastors in Mopani to come together and pray God to open up heaven and allow rain to fall down. The drought was severe at the time and underground water was almost finish.

During the imbizo, Pastors had an ample opportunity to raise genuine challenges that which municipalities and all authorities should look at, in assisting the smooth running of Churches. Amongst those were that, government and Traditional Authorities must refrain from allocating them sites which are close to taverns and shebeens, close to graveyards. Also of noting was that, when Preachers from outside municipal boundaries apply to conduct conferences, revivals and other form of prayers meetings, such application should be subjected to the scrutiny by the traditional authorities.

Critical achievement that the meeting adopted, was that a similar meeting should be arranged at least once a year, going forward, and that Pastor's should as well form part of government process and programmes, and be able to send their inputs and priorities regarding service deliver through municipal IDP processes.





Mopani MPAC hard at work

Mopani District Council appointed councillor City Modjadji as a chairperson of Municipal Public Account Committee (MPAC). Since its appointment MPAC has worked hard to strengthen oversight role and to make the municipality more efficient and effective in the use of resources.

Mopani District MPAC was appointed in line with section 79 of Local Government Municipal Structures Act N0 117 of 1998 after August 03 2016 community elections. MPAC provides oversight **role** over the executive **functions** of council and to ensure good governance in the **municipality**.

Mopani MPAC is under the tutelage of Councillor City Modjadji and the committee comprises seasonal and hardworking councilors. Councillor City Modjadji hails from Ga-Kgapane township in Greater Letaba Municipality. He is the erstwhile mayor of Greater Letaba Municipality and has served in that capacity for almost eight (8) years. He possesses a wealth of experience on local government. He has served African National Congress (ANC) in various capacities and is currently Mopani ANC Regional Executive Committee (REC) member. He has been an REC member for a very long time. On the academic front, councilor City Modjadji is a scholar of note who is currently enrolled for second year Masters degree in Public Administration with the University of Limpopo.

Mopani MPAC did not have time for a honeymoon after their appointment. In lieu, they have already held three day district wide session and conducted projects inspection in different parts of the district to inspect implementation progress. The committee managed to assess and tabled its report on the municipal mid-year report to council and successfully had an engagement session with the executive, whereby senior managers responded to issues raised in the mid-year report for the financial 2016/17. The committee had already developed questionnaires in preparation of the incoming district public hearing on the Municipal Annual Report of 2015/16. It had managed to achieve its milestone through teamwork, collective support from other council committees and municipal officials.

Mopani MPAC strives:

- To review the municipal's quarterly, mid-year and annual reports and develop the oversight report on the annual report for consideration by Council.
- To assist Council to maintain oversight over the implementation of Supply Chain Management Policy.
- To examine the financial statements and audit reports of the municipality and in doing so, the committee should consider improvements from previous statements and reports.
- To evaluate the extent to which the Audit Committee's and the Auditor General's recommendations have been implemented.

- To promote good governance, transparency and accountability on the use of the municipal resources.
- To examine the Mid-Year Review documents in line with Integrated Development Plans.
- To recommend or undertake any investigation in its area of competence on matters currently serving or has served before the committee.
- To seek any information and have access to it from any councillor/employee.
- To report to Council on the activities of the committee.
- To perform any other function assigned to the committee through a resolution of Council.

Councillor City Modjadji has no choice but to live up to the expectations. He is renowned to have performed well as the Mayor of Greater Letaba municipality through hands-on style of leadership.

Governance and Shared portfolio committee retreats to Phalaborwa

The Governance & Shared Portfolio Committee had a strategic retreat in Phalaborwa at Sefapane lodge from 23rd – 24th February 2017. The purpose of the session was for the committee to be fully exposed to the environment and to eventually be able to strategize. The executive arm of council was led by MMC Baloi N.N whereas the legislative arm was led by Portfolio Committee Chairperson Cllr Maluleke G.A. The retreat assisted both the MMC and Chairperson as it was also dealing with matters referred to the committee by the council.

The committee resolved on putting interventionary measures to ensure good governance within the institution. This included the following among others:

- ☐ The IT division to be resourced as per their earlier submissions on ensuring disaster recovery measures,
- ☐ The institutional policies to be updated and implemented to realise their purpose,
- ☐ The implementation of upper limits to be done in a manner that will not disadvantage any councillor at a later stage.
- ☐ The internal control and planning measures including organogram review to be expedited and aligned,
- ☐ The elements of municipal grading to be closely looked at by way of convincing council to apply revenue collection mechanisms, and
- The District IGR forum to be resuscitated with a focused attention.

The portfolio committee is chaired by a highly experienced and capable councillor Maluleke **GA**. Councillor Maluleke GA comes from Mnghonghoma village of Greater Giyani Municipality. He holds B. Proc and LLB degrees from University of Limpopo. He practised as Attorney from 2000 hitherto. In 2006 he was appointed as Commissioner of Small Claims Court in Giyani. From 2014 to 2016 he acted as Magistrate in Thohoyandou. Before becoming a councillor in Mopani District Municipality, Councillor Maluleke GA was an Executive Committee member in Greater Giyani Municipality. He is an asset to Mopani District Municipality and the municipality stands to derive immense benefits from him.

EXECUTIVE MAYOR AWARDS EXCELLENCE IN EDUCATION





opani District Municipality Executive Mayor Nkakareng Rakgoale in collaboration with the district department of Education hosted a district education excellence awards. The awards are aimed at appreciating best preforming schools, circuits, teachers and learners who performed extremely well during the 2016 academic year.

Cindy Mikateko Mabuza of St George High School in Nkowankowa Circuit scooped the overall best learner award, while Xihlovo Duncan Mabasa of Risinga High in Man'ombe Circuit and Nortjie Abel Hermanus of Ben Voester High came out in the second and third place respectively. Cindy Mikateko Mabuza went on to also win the best learner in accounting while Xihlovo Duncan Mabasa scooped the top learner award in both mathematics and physical science.

Speaking during the awards, Executive Mayor Rakgoale says the awards seek to also motivate learners and teachers to perform well. "These awards seek to acknowledge excellence bearing outcomes from some of the most important and visible stakeholders in the education sector which are learners, teachers, schools and also circuits. Education for us is and will remain a societal issue. I believe that there is no single stakeholder acting independently will produce the desired outcomes. "

Mokwane High School in Shiluvane Circuit managed to improve their results from 35 to 87 percent which made it the most improved school in the district. Saint George High School was crowned the best private school in terms of ordinary pass percentage while Mothoboni High School from Mamaila Circuit was awarded the best public ordinary school in terms of pass percentage.

Executive Mayor Rakgoale said the excellence shown during the previous academic year is acknowledged along the difficult conditions under which teachers often operate from. "We wish to salute all learners, schools and teachers who have emitted excellence in their service standards. We are here today to acknowledge your extraordinary efforts, which have been achieved in often under very difficult conditions in service to our children, many of whom come from poor communities," she said. Winners received trophies, certificate and laptops.





Mopani Speaker convenes a Ward Committee Conference

he Speaker of Mopani District Municipality, Cllr Wireless Sedibeng convened a Ward Committee conference on the 7-8 March 2017 at Karibu Lodge in Tzaneen. The conference which was attended by over 300 delegates, inclusive of all secretaries of ward committees, Councillors and Speakers across Mopani District, convened under the theme 'Building strong ward committees and strengthening participatory democracy' was aimed at creating a concrete platform for all ward committees in all five local municipalities to function actively and efficiently. The conference aimed at re-affirming that communities become an integral part of municipal programmes.

The Executive Mayor, during her opening speech, applauded the work which ward committees were doing within the 129 ward in Mopani District. She again emphasised the constitutional obligations that municipalities should effectively encourage the involvement of communities and community organisations in all the matters of local government, as enshrined in section 152 of the Constitution. The conference also gave a clear mandate that communities must come first, in all municipal programmes, and that service delivery must be a priority in order for them to bring change within this five (5) year term of office which is likely to end in year 2021.

One of the most important achievement of the conference, was the launching of the District Ward Committee Forum. The Speaker of Mopani launched 25 members elected during the conference to serve in the District Ward Committee Forum. This forum is chaired by the Speaker, and is mandated to ensure that all ward committees in all municipalities remain functional and are able to report all service delivery programmes and challenges to their respective Councils. The District Ward Committee Forum is represented by five members from each local municipality to be an advisory body to the Speaker, to enhance communication between the municipality and the community on municipal programmes and to assist in the mobilization of residents around Councils' activities.

By virtue of being the Speaker of Mopani District Municipality, Councillor Wireless Sedibeng presides over the District Speakers'



forum which comprises all Speakers of the local municipalities in Mopani. Councillor Wireless Sedibeng is a man of illustrious and impressive career. He hails from Mahekhwe village in Bolobedu under Greater Letabamunicipality. He is a pioneer par excellence. He is the first person from the village to obtain matric (grade 12), which he passed with flying colours. He is the first person from the village to enrol at tertiary, which he completed within the prescribed period. The first person from the village to qualify as the teacher and the first person from the village to become a principal of a school at a very young age. He is a university graduate with a B.A degree.

After the unbanning of the ANC and other political formations in 1990, he was instrumental in establishing structures of the ANC in Bolobedu East. He was the most acceptable face of the ANC in the area as the country was going through capricious political epoch. He is the founding chairpersons of ANC Rama branch and Bolobedu East Zone. He was elected as the deputy secretary of ANC North East Region. Again, he was the longest serving ANC Lowveld regional secretary. He was appointed ANC Mopani region deputy coordinator after the disbandment of then regional executive committee. He is currently the deputy secretary of the ANC in Mopani region. He is matured and seasoned cadre of the glorious movement who went through the acid test.



Wireless Sedibeng is one of the longest serving councillors in South Africa. He is part of the crop of councillors who participated in all phases of local government. He has served as a councillor from the pre-interim phase of 1994, throughout the transitional phase of 1995 to 2000 until now. He is the former Chairperson/ Mayor of Bolobedu Hlanganani Transitional Local Council (TLC) and he also served as the Chief Whip inGreater Letaba Municipality. He knows local government like the back of his hand. He is currently ensconced as the Speaker of



Mopani District Municipality after resigning as the District Senior Manager of **South African Social Security Agency (SASSA).**

It is against this background that the ward conference continued smoothly until its logical conclusion in capable hands. The conference concluded by declaring and endorsing that Ward Committees will play an effective role in bridging a gap between community stakeholders and municipalities as well as to ensure that healthy working relations between ward committees, traditional leaders and Community Development Workers are nurtured so that government service must be able to reach all communities.

EXECUTIVE MAYOR LAUNCHES DISTRICT AIDS COUNCIL

The Executive Mayor of Mopani District Municipality Cllr Nkakareng Rakgoale has, oncemore, led by example by proving to be the champion of her programs in general, HIV/AIDS in particular. The launch of the District AIDS Council was witnessed by various stakeholders on the 15th February 2017 at Giyani Banquet hall.

"This program will be leading and giving administrative support to core functions of government through refinement of policies, ensuring efficient and effective interventions in key matters relating to HIV/AIDS. This includes compliance with legislation in achieving Batho Pele principles and best service delivery practices," said Executive Mayor.

"We also want to put it before you, that this initiative is guided by the National and Provincial Policy Framework developed in line with the structural arrangements outlined in the HIV/AIDS and Sexually Transmitted Infections (STIs) strategic plan adopted between 2007-2011 to regularize and legalize the constitution and operations of these governance structures," explained Executive Mayor Rakgoale while giving the marching orders to those elected to serve in the district AIDS Council.

The official launch of Mopani District AIDS Council as a structure will ensure maximum consultation on any of matters relating to HIV/AIDS within the district, especially with key stakeholders executing their functions as stipulated and outlined by the strategic master plan for a period of five years.

"We hope that this structure will stick to its purpose according to the Policy Framework which is to promote an enabling environment for more effective and efficient delivery on commitments to fight against HIV and TB," added Executive Mayor while stating that it is expected that District AIDS Council members should also give support to HIV and TB Multi-Sectoral response in the entire district area.

During the launch it was emphasized that the council should work together with all the stakeholders including the technical team, including the department of Health in its co-ordination role and providing further services in order to realize the work of the AIDS Council.

Aids Councils are important forums for the encounter of experiences and peoples of different cultural backgrounds who share a positive desire for a better world. Through coordinated efforts to expand HIV prevention and treatment interventions, integrating HIV/AIDS into broader health services, increasing funding and improving human rights across vulnerable populations including reducing stigma and discrimination, society will begin to move towards an AIDS free generation. The goal is ambitious, but achievable.

In conclusion, Executive Mayor Rakgoale reiterated that members should take cognizance of their role as a monitoring body, to evaluate and implement resolutions of the AIDS Council. To come up with a communication plan, create community dialogues, do social mobilization and campaigns and in that way they will be doing justice to execution of their allocated responsibilities.

Annual Elders Day Celebration

MAYOR OFFICIALLY OPENS NEW ROAD & HANDOVER A HOUSE

Greater Tzaneen Municipality Mayor Maripe Mangena officially opened the newly tarred Tickelyline to Makhubidung Road on Wednesday 8th of March 2017. The road which is 3km long cost the municipality R16.4 million and was funded through the Municipal Infrastructure Grant (MIG). It will directly benefit residents in Tickelyline, Myakayaka, Glasswork and Makhubidung villages.

The road also links communities to Dr CN Phathudi Hospital, Shiluvane Library, Maake Plaza as well as various schools and Churches. At least 42 labour workers mostly locals were employed for the duration of the project. The road was also built through a local contractor.

Meanwhile, Mayor Mangena also handed over a house to a 26-year-old Delina Maenetja of Myakayaka village. Delina, a mother of two children aged 5 and 8 lived in a shack and had to be relocated as her shack was in the route of the new road.

Delina now occupies a standard RDP house in Myakayaka village. Delina who could not hide excitement said she felt blessed that she now has a house of her own. She said at least she now knows that if ever she dies her children will have a place to stay and no one will throw them out.

Speaking at low key event attended by locals and stakeholders, Mayor Maripe Mangena urged residents to look after the new infrastructure. He said that if they damaged the road instead of government bringing more development they would have to fix the damage which he said would slow development in the area. The road was built by Makasana Construction supervised by Southern Ambition Consulting Engineers (SACE).

The Mayor of Greater Tzaneen Municipality is a man of action. He is credited for personally making interventions whenever there are service delivery concerns. He is visible, energetic, affable and his leadership style is much appreciated by all and sundry.

Greater Giyani Municipality **Rain brought some relief**





The recent rains did not only bring some relief in most parts of the province that were hard hit by drought. It also brought hope in the families whose breadwinners are anglers who spend their time fishing by the bank of Nsami dam every day.

Hasani Baloyi is one of the anglers who fish by this bank. To him the abundance of water at Nsami dam does not only signifies the end of water struggle which saw many people scramble to get a drop of water last year, it also signifies an opportunity for more fish for his family.

Unlike other anglers who sell their catch in town, Baloyi sells his catch right there by the dam and in the community where he lives. "There are people who wait for me at home to buy fresh fish when I return in the evenings," he explained.

Baloyi is no different to the rest of the individual traders that are found in Giyani town. Each day these hawkers fight tooth-and-nail to ensure that their families have something to eat through the little sales that they make. These sales, when combined are said to boost local economy with jobs creation.

The municipality has therefore developed strategies through which it supports hawkers in the form of creating conducive working environment for them. "We have started a process of registering them," explained the head for Strategic Planning and Local Economic Development Cllr Elisa Mabunda, saying the municipality plans to set aside a budget in future in order to build them a flea market.

According to her, local hawkers contribute up to 8% of the municipality's economic growth.

"Our informal studies indicate that we have a circulation amount of more than R50 000 a day between local businesses and hawkers which boosts employment in our municipality," she said adding that there were plans to revamp the whole town.

"We're going to meet with local businesses to discuss plans which would see all old buildings in our town getting re-newed in order to attract investors," she concluded.
